And the local album is called **Jenifer** with 10 tracks. Rob Prophet and the band also released 2 singles last year 2017. The songs are **Going to Zion** and **Sabbatha**. These songs were requested by our South American promoters from Golpe Cerrrado Records. The Prophets we play Music in so many international languages namely English, Swahili, Ganda and Zulu to mention but a few. 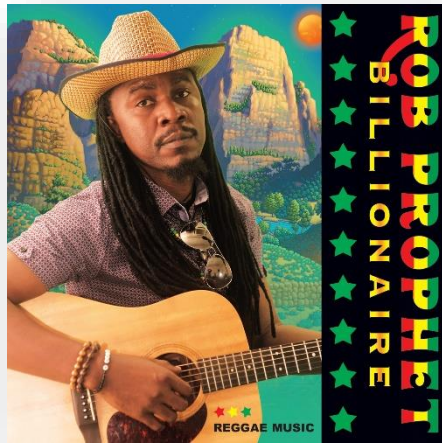

Penzi Letu: A Swahili, Isizulu, English and Ganda love song, which is all about a couple celebrating their love in peace and harmony.

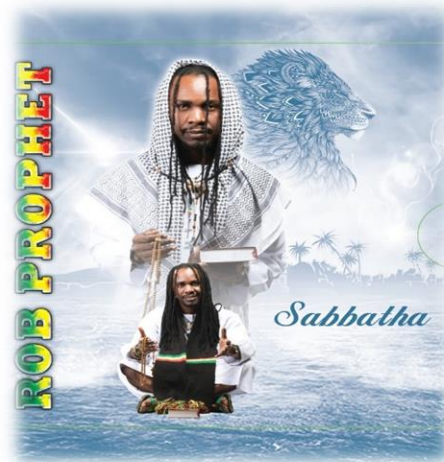
My Son: A song that explains hardships that the parents went through, and never made it as a couple. In this song the father teaches the Son how he has to grow and the realities of life.

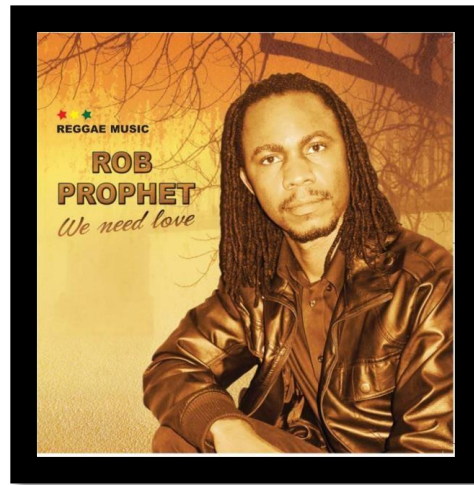
SABBATHA AND GOING TO ZION SINGLES
